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Why BTL-COP? What is the challenge?



Poverty-driven local crime can be a gateway into wider criminal networks but is missed when trust collapses.



Declining trust

Confidence in police is falling among poorer communities and minority groups facing racism, misogyny and exclusion so crime goes unreported.



Aporophobia

Stigmatisation of the poor, now recognised as a hate crime, leaves vulnerable people exposed to exploitation and grooming by criminals.



Intelligence gaps

At the local-global interface, minor crimes tied to organised networks slip past over-stretched police, leaving neighbourhoods less safe.

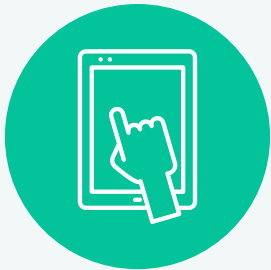


Six concrete results, piloted in four cities and designed to be adopted by police forces across Europe.



TING Model

Safe neighbourhood community-of-practice for shared police-community leadership.



BondMate device

Community-friendly safe-alert device empowering vulnerable people in critical moments.



Trust Framework

First standardised tools to measure police-community trust, culture-aware.



Intelligence Toolkit

Actionable community-policing guidance distilled from the four regions.



Security Helix

150+ organisation network for clustering, dissemination and lasting impact.



Train-the-Trainers

Curricula for police and judicial actors, embedding aporophobia awareness.
